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RHEINGLANDER PALE EXPORT

HARRY BRIDGES CASE
INVESTIGATION ON

Federal Agent Assembling Material for Report to Labor Department.

SAN FRANCISCO, May 10.—(AP)—A preliminary investigation of Harry Bridges, incident to proposals that the west coast C.I.O. leader be deported, was under way today.

John J. McGrath, immigration commissioner here, said a representative of the department of labor was on a "tour of the north-west and California" preparing a report for Secretary of Labor Frances Perkins, and "it is very possible that that plans will be made for the taking of testimony" in this area.

McGrath also said "in fairness to Bridges and in fairness to the department of labor, I would like to see the (supreme) court have the last word."

"Mrs. Perkins has a very open mind on the subject and she wants to be fair, but in this case she'll be damned if she does and damned if she doesn't. * * * If Bridges' hands are clean he has nothing to fear from the court."

He said testimony, if such is taken later, would be presented to a "board of five persons, with Mrs. Perkins probably one of them, and they might be taken to the supreme court."

McGrath also commented the "Stricker case may have considerable to do with the final findings." (In the Joseph G. Stricker case, the supreme court held that part membership in the communist party was not grounds for deportation.)

Bridges, a native of Australia, has been accused of membership in the communist party. He has denied it. He has taken out first citizenship papers.

MAY SEND TROOPS
TO END COAL WAR

FRANKFORT, Ky., May 10.—(AP)—Governor A. B. Chandler said today unless eastern Kentucky coal mines were operating by Monday he would send national guard troops into the area to give protection to men waiting to work.

"There is no dispute between representatives of the mine union and the operators with respect to wages, working hours, or working conditions," Governor Chandler said.

"The whole controversy is a demand for 'closed shops' and elimination of penalty clauses to prohibit illegal strikes both of which are aimed at keeping American Federation members from the mines and both provisions are being insisted upon by John L. Lewis (president of the United Mine Workers of America) and the C.I.O." (which Lewis also heads), Chandler added.

Chandler made public a letter from Harlan County Judge C. E. Ball declaring 75 per cent of the miners "are facing starvation" and want to return to work, that the "situation is beyond the control of the county officials," and reopening of the mines would mean trouble and bloodshed unless we have soldiers in sufficient number to keep order."
