OREGON TRAFFIC DEATH TOLL UP

SALEM, June 3.—(AP)—Oregon's traffic fatality toll for the first five months of 1939 was 111, compared with 99 for the same period last year, Secretary of State Earl Snell said today.

The total for May was 21, five less than during May, 1938.

Eleven of the 36 counties have not had a traffic death during the year. They are Benton, Crook, Gilliam, Harney, Jefferson, Josephine, Sherman, Wallowa, Wasco and Wheeler.
