NEW GRANGE AT CURTIN

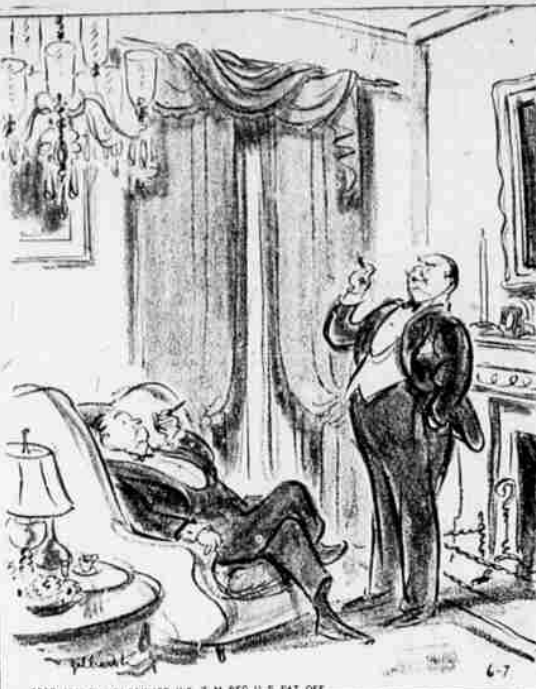
June 5 Arthur Brown, state deputy for the grange, organized a unit at Curtin with a well-filled charter list.
