NETHERLANDS WILL ACCEPT 200 JEWS
AMSTERDAM, The Netherlands, June 12.—(AP)—The ministry of justice announced today it would permit the landing in the Netherlands of 200 of the 907 German Jews refugees aboard the Hamburg-Amerika liner St. Louis.

The refugees, refused admittance to Cuba and Mexico, are bound back to Germany aboard the liner.

Permission was granted for the emigrants to stay in this country, until they can find other possible refuge, after the request of a Netherlands Jewish refugees committee.

Negotiations were reported under way in Paris to land the remainder of the St. Louis' emigrants in France and Belgium.
