BETTER NURSING CONDITIONS SOUGHT

PORTLAND, June 14.—(AP)—

A campaign to better community nursing conditions was launched today at the annual Oregon Nurses' association convention.

The association authorized appointment of an investigating committee representing the nurses, Oregon Organization for Public Health Nursing and the Oregon League of Nursing Education.

"Improvement in nursing will follow when a community realizes the problems which affect the care of the sick," Miss Olive Whitlock, chairman of a preliminary survey committee, said. "We believe if an active community nursing council understood the possibilities for developing the public health services in its community that care could be given to many persons now sick who are not receiving attention either in their own homes or in hospitals because of their inability to pay."

The organization for public health nursing, meeting simultaneously, asserted Oregon, with 93 per cent, led the nation last year in the percentage of public health nurses enrolled in its organization. Miss Catherine Webster, consultant for the state board of health, was elected president.
