

REHABILITATION

DISCUSSED BY DAV

EUGENE, June 14.—(AP)—Making the rehabilitation of disabled American war veterans their chief concern, members of the Oregon D. A. V. passed a series of resolutions today concerning the veterans' compensation, authorization of organization officials, employment of veterans instead of students, and provision of more adequate facilities for the University of Oregon military department.

The sessions today were devoted to serious discussion and deliberation of the question of making secure the compensation awarded to disabled veterans, particularly those in the lower disability rate brackets.

Figures presented to the convention from the veterans' administration report to congress two years ago showed the average income of \$29 per month, with 250,000 disabled ex-servicemen receiving less than \$59 a month.

A resolution passed asked that the state board of higher education be urged to provide more adequate facilities for the military department of the university in Eugene.

The veterans resolved on the appointment of a committee to call upon the governor to enforce the state law which refers to the employment of disabled veterans by the state highway department on jobs not requiring perfect physical condition.

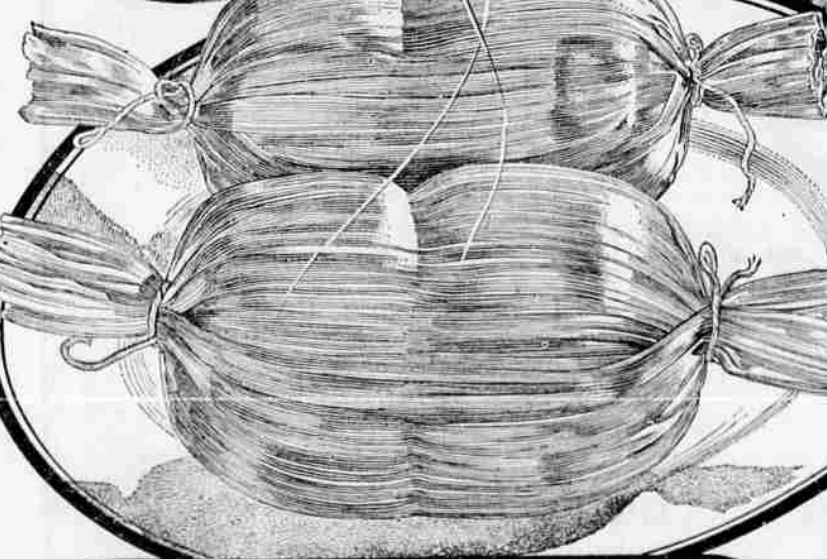

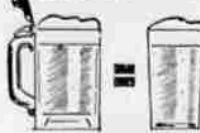
