OREGON PIONEERS. DESCENDANTS RALLY

PORTLAND, June 15.—(AP)—Sons and Daughters of Oregon Pioneers elected Walter Hembree of Portland president here last night, succeeding Mrs. Margaret Seiple, also of Portland.

Mrs. E. H. Whitely, Portland, was chosen vice-president; Ormond R. Bean, Portland, secretary; Mrs. Seiple, treasurer, and Amanda Outfield Hart, Portland, historian.

Oregon pioneers, many of them survivors of the mountains about the time of the Civil war, held their 67th annual reunion at the public auditorium, paying homage to George H. Himes, 95, secretary of the pioneer association for 53 years and curator of the Oregon Historical society for 41.

Mrs. Anna M. Niles, 85, born on a donation land claim in Jackson county, was crowned queen mother.

Captain John W. Cullen, who will celebrate his 101st birthday Sunday, was the guest of honor yesterday at an Indian war veteran reunion. The captain is the last of those who kept the trail open against hostile Indians in the 1850's. Surrounding the aged fighter were his own children and grandchildren as well as members of the Sons and Daughters of Indian War Veterans.

The Glencullen pioneer was re-elected president of the Indian veteran association. Mrs. Minnie McGregor became senior vice-commander. Mrs. Grace Barth Todd, junior vice-commander; Mrs. Ida J. Steele, chaplain, and Mrs. Anna Sharron, grand adjutant.
