NEW TYPE BOMBER SUCCESS IN TEST

SEATTLE, June 28.—(AP)—A new highly streamlined "Flying Fortress" for the United States army performed its first flight test satisfactorily over Seattle yesterday. The four-motored all metal monoplane, first of a fleet of 39 to be produced at the Boeing Airplane company's plant, includes all features of the present "flying fortresses" in the army air service and in addition has several new features, chief of which is a special engine supercharging system for peak performance at high altitudes. The new bomber is powered by four 1,600-horsepower engines and equipped with hydromatic full-feathering propellers. It has a gross weight of approximately 22 tons, a wing span of some 165 feet, a length of approximately 70 feet and an overall height of 15 feet. It carries five machine gun emplacements, one in the nose and four others in the form of stream-
