SENATE REBUKED ON MONEY POWER VOTE

HYDE PARK, N. Y., June 27.—(AP)—President Roosevelt said today control over money would revert to Wall street and international speculators if he were deprived of his power to devalue the dollar further.

The discontinuance of that authority, he said at a press conference, also would strike a very definite blow at national defense because a country can be weakened by hurting its foreign trade.

In emphatic language, the president rebuked the senate for the vote yesterday by which it stripped from a bill to extend key administration monetary powers a provision removing his right to lower the gold content of the dollar again.

That action, he added, was by no means final, since the house has approved extension of the devaluation power and a joint senate-house committee must try to reach an agreement on the legislation.

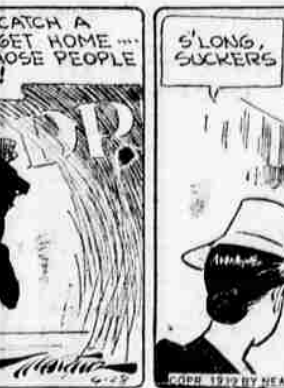
