WASHINGTON, June 30.—(AP)—President Roosevelt said today he probably would start a trip to the west coast four days after congress adjourns but reporters at his press conference weren't sure just how he meant the remark.

The date of the trip has been a frequent press conference topic. Today the president tossed off his latest comment on it with a quick grin and told his questioners facetiously that thus they knew all about the subject.

They later professed, however to be about as much in the dark as ever.

The trip, to the San Francisco world's fair and Alaska, has been deferred several times because of conditions in congress.
