JAP AIRMEN PLAN GOODWILL FLIGHT

VANCOUVER, B. C., July 12.—(CP)—A crew of Japanese airmen will fly across the Pacific from Japan to Vancouver next month on the first leg of a goodwill flight around the world, according to word received by Japanese consul H. Nemichi here.

The consul said the plane, powered by two 900-horsepower engines and with a cruising speed of almost 300 miles an hour, would make the flight by way of Nome, Alaska, and the Yukon territory.

The cable to the consul asked him to arrange a reception for the flyers here but gave no definite date of their take-off or arrival.

"I merely know that the plane will reach here sometime late in August on its way around the world," Hon. Nemichi said.

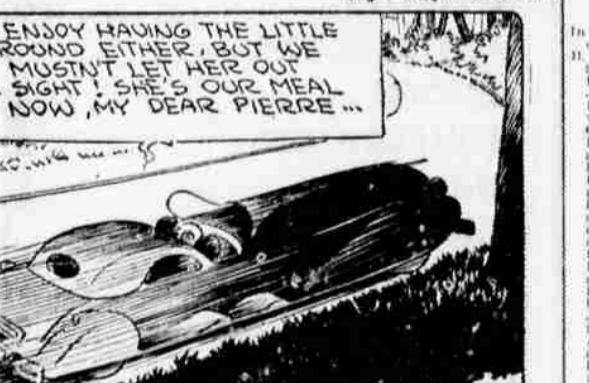
