JOBS FOR NATIONAL GUARD MEN ASKED

An appeal for permanent jobs for young men who hold membership in the local company of the Oregon national guard was made today by R. L. Irving, commanding officer.

"Our greatest problem in maintaining the Roseburg company in the turnover in membership," Mr. Irving stated. "We have a fine bunch of young men in the guard company, but it is so difficult for them to find permanent work that they are forced to go to other communities and must, therefore, be discharged."

"If it were possible to help these deserving young men to find local employment, it would not only be beneficial to the national guard company, but would also assure future good citizenship for the community," Captain Irving declared.

"These young men are all of good character and they have displayed sufficient patriotism to enlist for the defense of the country. They are the type of young men who may be employed with assurance that they will do their best on the jobs to which they are assigned."

Mr. Irving asks that persons willing to give preference to national guardsmen in the matter of employment, contact himself or Lieutenant Wallace Robertson at Clark's studio.

FLYING BOAT BEGINS HOP FOR ENGLAND

BOTWOOD, Newfoundland, July 12.—(Canadian Press.)—A 15-ton flying boat built in California for the British royal air force left here at 8:30 a. m. today for Felixstowe, England. Aboard were Russell Rogers as pilot and a crew of three.

The big bomber arrived here yesterday afternoon from Buffalo, N. Y., where it had landed for refueling en route from San Diego, Calif.

Rogers planned to follow the route of the trans-Atlantic clippers and expected to reach Felixstowe, 2,100 miles away early tomorrow morning.

M'NUTT ASSAILED IN SENATE DEBATE

Hatch Says FSA Position Should Not Be Held by White House Seeker.

WASHINGTON, July 12.—(AP)—Senator Hatch (D., U. S. M.), said today Paul V. McNutt should give up his position as federal N. E. administrator if he wants to campaign for the democratic presidential nomination.

Hatch, author of a bill to ban political activity by government employees, told reporters his measure would not prevent McNutt from campaigning because it does not apply to the president, cabinet members or policy-making government officials.

But he expressed the belief if McNutt or any members of the cabinet steps out for the presidential nomination, "he should disassociate himself from his official position."

McNutt's nomination to head the FSA was confirmed by the senate late yesterday after a sharp political debate between republicans and democrats.

"Assessment" Ban Asked
Senator Bridges (R., N. H.) demanded the senate approve a resolution forbidding McNutt from establishing "two per cent clubs" among the thousands of FSA workers. He said he did not want McNutt to "assess the salaries of his employees for political purposes."

Assessing Indiana state employees had been forced to contribute two per cent of their earnings while McNutt was the state's governor. Bridges said this was "one of the most heinous political rackets" ever practiced.

Bridges' resolution was quickly tabled on motion of Democratic Leader Barkley, but the blindly worded debate continued for an hour. Senator Minton (D., Ind.), who is supporting McNutt for the presidential nomination, told the senate the latter had not established Indiana's "two per cent clubs."
