PORTLAND, July 15.—(AP)—Three confessed arsonists serving seven-year terms each in the Oregon penitentiary drew additional three-year sentences in Multnomah county circuit court yesterday but the terms will run concurrently.

Ernest Carson, Jr., John Newlands and Cecil Moore were sentenced by Circuit Judge Kanizer for violence and destruction of property.

They pleaded guilty in Polk county to burning the West Salem box factory.

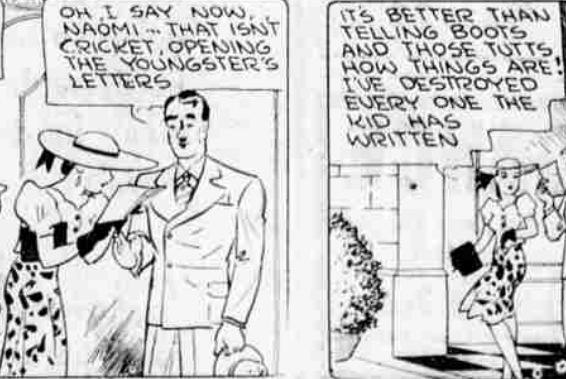
