NURSERY BUSINESS OF U. S. PROTESTED

PORTLAND, July 17.—(AP)—The American Association of Nurserymen asked the federal government to get out of the tree nursery business at the close of the annual convention here.

A resolution opposed governmental production of seedlings for reforestation. Richard P. White, Washington, D. C., said the government had raised 500,000,000 seedlings, including many ornamental shrubs, ostensibly for reforestation purposes.

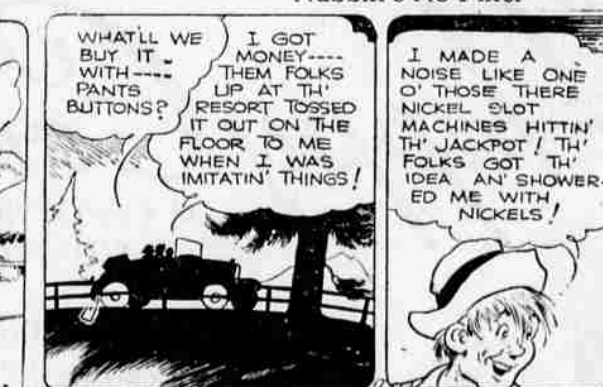
