FUGITIVE CONVICT RUSSELL CAUGHT

OSARK, Ark., July 18.—(AP)—Sheriff Champ Crawford of Franklin county, accompanied only by a constable, today captured without resistance the desperado, Jack Russell, Oklahoma penitentiary escapee wanted for a slaying and two kidnappings.

Russell was taken into custody at a fishing camp near Gas, Ark., 15 miles north of Ozark, where he had spent the night.

Russell was sought for the brutal kidnap-slaying of Billy S. Hamilton, 23-year-old Arkansas City, Kas., flour salesman near Ringwood, Ill., last Friday and for conspiring concerning kidnappings of R. E. Brown at McAlester and Ed Egholm of Oklahoma City in Kenosha, Wis. Egholm's car was abandoned in Kansas City by the fugitive early yesterday when he took the car of Police Captain Joseph P. Welsh from a main street garage.
