day the United States sold \$320,864,000 more merchandise abroad in the first half of the year than it purchased from foreigners.

The export excess, however, was only about half the size of the unusually large excess piled up in the same period last year.

The department attributed the decline in exports partly to lower commodity prices, but primarily to decreased volume shipments of cotton, wheat and corn.

The gain in merchandise imports spread over virtually all types of commodities. Whiskey was an exception, imports declining because of the growing availability of aged whiskey from domestic sources.
