VESSEL WRECKED ON ALASKAN COAST

KETCHIKAN, Alaska, Aug. 7.—(AP)—The hull split open but her crew safe, the Alaska Steamship company's freighter Depere was high and dry on the beach, a mile north of Petersburg today after losing in an attempt to run treacherous Wrangell narrows in a blinding fog.

The 320-foot vessel, pushed by a swirling aft tide, ground into the concrete and steel structure supporting a lighted beacon on Protery rock in the narrows yesterday at 6:30 a. m. Capt. Henry Burns reported to his company here that fog completely obscured the beacon. The ship pushed the heavy steel rails supporting the light eight degrees out of line but did not extinguish the light, the United States lighthouse service said.

The captain ordered the ship beached after he found 10 feet of water in a hold. A coal stow container left here yesterday to investigate the wreck and to aid the survivors.

The Depere, built in 1920, was on a trip from Ketchikan to Juneau with lumber and general cargo when she struck.

FERTILIZER DOLE WILL BE CONTINUED

CORVALLIS, Aug. 7.—(AP)—N. C. Donaldson, state AAA executive officer, announced distribution of phosphate fertilizer to Oregon farmers would be continued this fall and spring. The cost will be absorbed in benefit payments.

Approximately 2000 tons will be available in 23 counties for land devoted to soil conserving crops.

A requirement is that the fertilizer be used only on lands devoted to soil conserving crops such as pecanaria, pasture, alfalfa, red clover and similar grasses and legumes. The program is similar to one last spring in which 1900 tons were distributed.

County conservation committees will be in charge of distribution. Application is made through county secretaries.

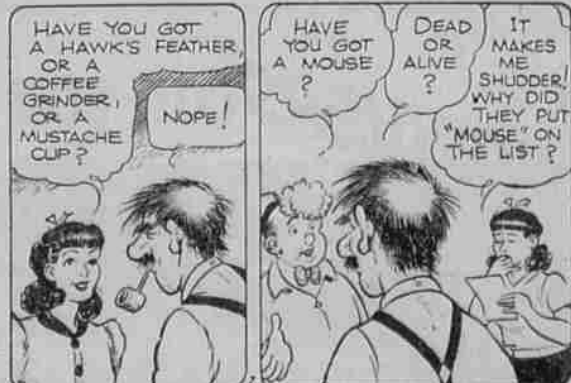
