Retirement benefit for 44,500 postmasters became law Saturday, when President Roosevelt signed the Neely bill, which was recently passed by both houses of congress. It was announced today by Postmaster Lester L. Wimberly. The measure was part of the program sponsored by the National Association of Postmasters. Social security for the postmasters becomes effective January 1, 1940, and will include all postmasters in the smallest and largest cities of the United States.
