GIRL KIDNAPER, 18, PUT IN STATE HOME

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 10.—(AP)—An attractive young nursemaid who admitted kidnapping a five-year-old ward was committed to a state home for girls.

She was Margaret Polly Well, 18, former Napa, N. Y., farm girl. The girl was taken into custody at a hotel in San Jose, Calif., 50 miles south of San Francisco, June 8—the day after she and Krohn Osborn disappeared from the Osborn home where a note demanding \$1500 ransom was found.

The boy was not harmed. Miss Well told officers she needed the \$1500 to pay off a mortgage on her mother's farm at Napa.

TAX BURDENS ON EUROPEANS CITED

PORTLAND, Aug. 11.—(AP)—Building is on the boom in some European countries but it doesn't mean much because the taxes border on confiscation, Fred Taylor, of Portland, delegate to the International conference on housing and town planning at Stockholm in July, said on return yesterday.
