

YANKEES CERTAIN TO WIN PENNANT

New York Team Able to
Coast Along for Balance
of Season.

By taking 12 of their last 15 games, the most recent a double header sweep at 7-2 and 16-4 over the red hot Chicago White Sox yesterday, the New York Yankees are in a spot now where by playing .500 ball the rest of the way in the Boston Red Sox could overtake them only by moving at a .730 pace.

In the light of recent developments, it appears the parties of the second part in this fall's world series will be those not-so-distant Reds from Cincinnati. They tossed a row of goose-eggs at the Phillies yesterday for a 3-0 decision to climb 5½ games in front of the National League, while the St. Louis Cardinals lost their third straight to Brooklyn, 8-4.

That double win, incidentally, boosted the Yanks eight hill games in front of the Red Sox, who took their single game in St. Louis, 9-1, as Fritz Ostermeier tossed a four-hitter.

Pitching masterpieces of the day was turned in by Sailor Bill Ponder and his dailier tail, with a one-hitter, which gave the Boston Bees a 1-0 decision over the Pittsburgh Pirates. Deacon Danny MacFadden muffed the Buc bats, 3-1, in the nightcap for a sweep of the hill.

Seven homers were hit in Detroit before the Athletics nipped the Tigers, 7-0, in 11 innings, in the only other American League game. The Chicago Cubs collected a dozen hits and trampled the weary New York Giants, 8-3.

The faltering Los Angeles Angels, for half the season the top team in the Pacific Coast Baseball league, were 10 full games behind Seattle's Rainiers today after dropping a 7 to 4 decision to the league leaders in the series opener.

Seattle, heading full speed toward the pennant, scored six runs in a big sixth inning at Los Angeles last night to drop the Angels only one and one-half games ahead of the third-place San Francisco Seals.

The Rainiers blasted 14 hits off four Los Angeles pitchers, half of the blows in the disastrous sixth, while Kewpie Dick Barrett pitched the route for the winners. Barrett gave up 10 hits, four of them in the third when the Angels bunched three runs.

San Francisco meanwhile plastered a 14 to 2 defeat on Portland at San Francisco, clustering five runs in the opening frame, four in the next inning and four in the sixth.

In another free-hitting affair, San Diego nipped Hollywood, 12 to 10, at San Diego to move up a step into sixth place, and at Sacramento, the last-place Oakland Oaks scored one run in the sixth on Manager Johnny Varga's single to beat out Sacramento, 1 to 0, as Jack Fallon beat Tom Seals in a pickling duel.
