

Roseburg Public Schools to Open September 11th

ENROLLMENT GAIN THOUGHT UNLIKELY

Registration Instructions
Given by Superintendent
W. M. Campbell.

Monday, September 11, has been set as the opening date for the Roseburg public schools. The number of young people who will enter at that time is expected to be approximately the same as last year when 1209 entered at the beginning of the school year, according to W. M. Campbell, city superintendent of schools.

The enrollment last year was divided between the buildings as follows: Senior High 361; Junior High 354; Benson 222, Rose 169, Fullerton 123.

Registration of students in the Senior and Junior High schools

will be held from Tuesday to Thursday, September 5, 6 and 7. At the Senior High, 12th grade students will register on Tuesday, 11th grade on Wednesday and 10th grade on Thursday. At the Junior High, the 9th grade students will register on Tuesday, 8th grade on Wednesday, and 7th grade on Thursday. All students of these two buildings are urged to register on the dates indicated. Provision is made for those registering later, but subject and class preferences are given to those who register on the dates stated.

Boundaries Unchanged

Elementary pupils will register at their respective buildings on Monday, September 11. The boundary lines of the elementary districts will be the same as last year. All students living west of the railroad tracks shall attend Fullerton school; those living east of the tracks and north of Washington street shall attend Benson; and those living east of the tracks and south of Washington street shall attend Rose. Some transfer of students living near these boundary lines may be necessary to prevent overcrowding of some

grades. The children in the Benson district who were transferred to Miss Carothers' first grade room at Rose last year will continue in Miss Snedaker's second grade at Rose this year.

New first grade classes will start at each of the three elementary schools. Any child who will be six years of age by November 15, may start school on the opening date, September 11.

ATTORNEY DIES AT SUIT HEARING

OAKLAND, Calif., Aug. 29.—(AP)—James Lenox Ward, 65, Oakland attorney for 10 years, collapsed in superior court today and was pronounced dead upon arrival at a hospital. He was appearing in a civil suit as counsel.

Ward was born in Shell Rock, Ia., and attended Upper Iowa university. He formerly practiced law in Washington state and was prosecuting attorney at Yakima, Wash., eight years.

DEATH TAKES HEAD OF VETS HOSPITAL

WALLA WALLA, Aug. 29.—(AP)—Dr. Orville D. Wescott, manager of the U. S. veterans hospital here, died from a heart attack Tuesday. He was 68 years old and a native of Iowa. Survivors include: His widow, Mrs. Mary Ann Wescott of this city; a sister, Mrs. Theodore Loder, Easton, Pa.

Wescott came here January 12, 1928, from Muskogee, Okla., where he had been manager of the veterans facility since 1923. Previously he had been in charge of the Legion, Texas, facility. He entered the public health service in 1920 after spending more than two years in the medical corps during the World war, a year of which was in France. He was with the

army of occupation in Germany, four months.

He was chief of the tuberculosis service of the veterans bureau in Washington, D. C., from 1924 to 1926.

VETERINARIAN JOB IN OREGON FILLED

SALEM, Aug. 29.—(AP)—Dr. Rod C. McCormack, who has been with the California livestock inspection department for several years, was appointed today assistant state veterinarian.

He is a graduate of Oregon State college and a son of former State Sen. E. A. McCormack of Eugene. He succeeds Dr. H. H. Green, who resigned to serve with the Portland city meat inspection department.
