October 28, Will Benefit

The play, the Pulitzer prize winner of 1938, written by Thornton Wilder, is to be given by the University of Oregon drama division and the proceeds from the local showing will be used for the proposed swimming pool.

Horace G. Robinson, director of the play and a member of the cast, did not pick the players from any one group, but from the entire community of Eugene in all walks of life, and with the physical and mental characteristics necessary for the parts.

"Our Town" is produced entirely without scenery, except for plain chairs and tables and two garden stools. The play, informal and of high moral tone, lends atmosphere which sets it apart from any other production.

Ex-Roseburg Girl in Cast
Of interest to local residents will be the fact that Miss Mary Margaret Gentry, a former resident of this city, is cast in the play as Rebecca Gibbs, and, according to reports from Eugene, Miss Gentry plays the small part to the hilt.
The play is based on everyday happenings in any town, family life, work and school, citizenship, love and marriage and finally death. With these factors, Wilder built a play which has for a successful year on Broadway, and has been selected by amateur groups more than any other play in a similar amount of time.

SUPPORT GOOD FOR
HIGHWAY ASSN. AIMBottleneck Breaking Plan
Lines Up Members In
City of Roseburg.

Roseburg is making an excellent response to the clean-up membership campaign to aid the efforts of the Oregon Pacific Highway association to break the bottleneck from Roseburg to Grants Pass, and make other necessary improvements to No. 99, according to Lloyd McDowell, public relations counsel, now in the city. Senator C. W. Clark is chairman of the Roseburg committee.

The Roseburg chamber of commerce, through its secretary, W. C. Harding, has been one of the foremost organizations in southern Oregon, working not only in Douglas county, but assisting in other counties for the rejuvenation of the Pacific highway in the best interests of a greater tourist travel to Roseburg and vicinity. A. C. Martens, of Roseburg, is vice-president of the association, and is working hard for the association program.

"With the large membership I found in Roseburg upon arrival, secured earlier in the year by the chamber of commerce, we now have about 80 members, with more than thirty to be contacted," said McDowell.

Good Cooperation Given
"I have had some very fine cooperation from the chamber of commerce, and in the Stephens street district, where George Smith, of the Hotel Rose, an ardent booster for highways, J. A. Hart, of the New Service Laundry, and G. M. Krell, of the Western Auto Supply, and myself formed two committees and added close to 20 new members in a very short time. The Parkinson's food store broadcast Monday over KRRR was most helpful in the explanation of the highway association work in Roseburg, and newspapers have aided their support to the campaign.

"An entire block on Jackson street remained uncovered, and Thomas H. Ness, manager of the California Oregon Power company, offered his services with the result that with his assistance this entire district was promptly covered Monday with excellent results.

"Office buildings offer a problem, and in the Medical Arts building Dr. L. A. Billard, former president of the chamber of commerce, has been of great assistance.

More Members Desired
"If any doctors, dentists, attorneys or other Roseburg professional men and business men would like to be members of the Oregon Pacific Highway association and will call me at the Hotel Rose I will be glad to explain the purpose of the organization," Mr. McDowell said. "Sustaining memberships are needed at this time, and they do not represent very much money," he explained.

"The out-state turn-back at Grants Pass this year was 58.88 per cent, the greatest on record. Tourists, in many cases, will not travel the highway from Grants Pass to Roseburg with the result that this year it is estimated about \$5,000,000 in potential tourist revenue never came north of Grants Pass. This is an increase of more than 41 per cent over 1934.

"The work of making a permanent survey from Wolf creek to Grants Pass is progressing rapidly, and there is every reason to believe that with the Oregon Pacific Highway association at work in the interest of the state's oldest road, the desired results in publicity and improvements may be forthcoming in the near future," said Mr. McDowell.

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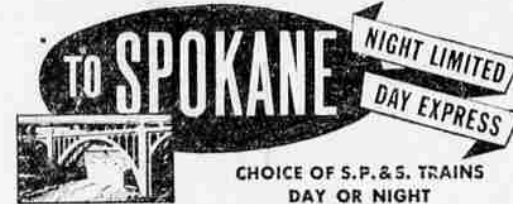
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
