WOOL
BOSTON, Oct. 28 (AP)—The Commercial Bulletin today says: "Business has been slow in the wool market again this week and quotations are difficult to make. On the whole, there appears to be little change as against a week ago, short supplies being used as an argument to hold up prices."

"Little business has been done in the west this week, growers still holding for prices that do not permit dealers to turn wool at a profit, although frequently asking prices of leaders are 2 to 3 cents lower than a fortnight ago."

"Foreign markets have shown little that is really new as bearish on this market, South America and the cape are a bit lower for the week."

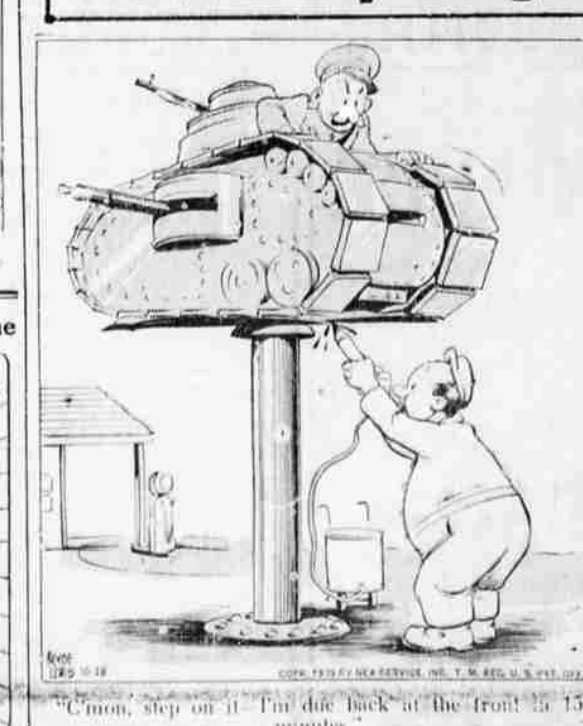
"The manufacturing position appears very sound, with deliveries being made steadily and some further commitments reported both in woollens and worsteds."

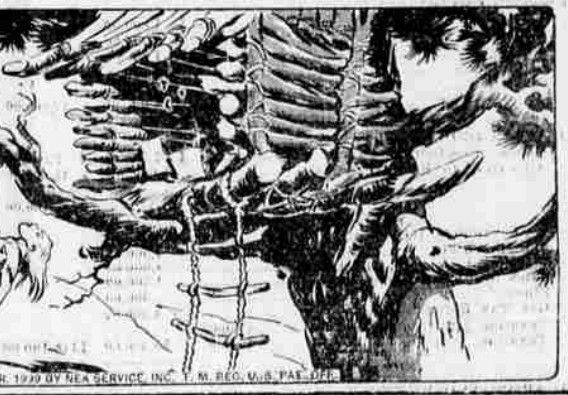
