MILLIONS PAID IN BOOKMAKER RACKET

CHICAGO, Nov. 7.—(AP)—Government prosecutors, fighting an attempt by the Amberg racing information agencies to maintain their vice lines, contended in federal court today that between 1933 and 1936, "bookmakers, gamblers and similar persons" paid \$7,721,531 for Amberg services.

Samuel Klaus, special assistant attorney general, told the court that in the Chicago area alone the Amberg enterprises have 662 customers "only three of which are newspapers." Total income to the Amberg enterprises from newspapers and press associations for the same years was \$47,000 Klaus said.

Klaus was opposing a petition by the Amberg agencies to prevent the American Telegraph and Telephone company and the Illinois Bell Telephone company from denying them their service.

The government has indicted the racing information organization for violation of the federal lottery statute, and the two communications systems, as well as Western Union Telegraph company, have signified their intentions of ending service to the Amberg concerns Thursday noon.

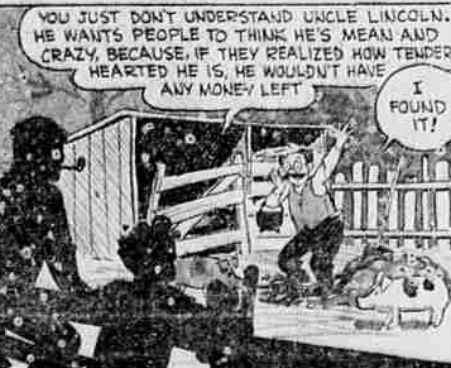
