PORTLAND, Nov. 13.—(AP)—Walter L. Toozie, state republican chairman, said Saturday Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Montana and Wyoming G. O. P. national convention delegates would meet Dec. 23 at Spokane.

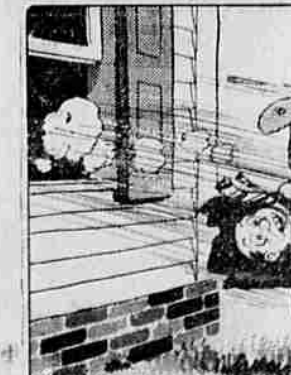
