INTERESTING MEETING OF DR. LEAVITT'S CLASS IS HELD

An exceedingly interesting talk was given to the members of Dr. Leavitt's psychology class last Monday evening by William J. Moore, chief aide of the occupational therapy department of the veterans administration facility at this city, which was illustrated by a number of remarkable articles which have been fabricated by mentally ill persons. At the close of the talk, Moore extended an invitation to members of the class to visit the occupational therapy shops at the facility and acquaint themselves further with the type of occupational treatment being furnished patients hospitalized there.

The class lecture in psychology by Doctor Leavitt was on the subject of social diseases. Doctor Leavitt is making arrangements to secure pamphlets covering information and statistics on this important subject to be placed in the hands of every member of this class.

The lecture for November 27 was on the subject of neurosis, or conditions of nervousness of apparently well people, followed by a discussion of interesting angles suggested by class members.

In the speech class, which follows the psychology class, members have been requested to prepare types of readings which will help them to overcome their speech faults as indicated by class criticism.

Last Monday afternoon, Dr. Leavitt talked before the Fullerton Parent Teachers association. The members voted to have a monthly lecture, as a regular feature, to be given the third Monday of each month. The lecture is to be for 30 minutes, followed by a similar period of time given to discussion. The theme voted upon for the next meeting was on the effect of the nervous parents upon the emotional life of the child.
