Oregon Cities Seek Trade of Tourists

With prospects of an increased tourist travel to Oregon and the entire west in 1940, due to war conditions in Europe, chambers of commerce and tourist agencies in many cities are bending their efforts towards reaching prospective travelers with their messages within the next 60 or 90 days. This was the word brought to Roseburg by Lloyd McDowell of the Pacific Highway association at the Umpqua hotel, en route to Medford and Grants Pass in the interest of greater travel to all cities and scenic spots in Oregon. Just before leaving Portland I learned that the Pacific Northwest Tourist association planned participation in travel shows in Chicago, Detroit, Cincinnati and possibly Philadelphia, this coming spring.

"Ray Clark, manager of the Danmore hotel in Portland, is now vice-president of the association and organizing to see that Oregon communities, especially along highway 99, have a part so that travel will be encouraged to Roseburg, Oregon caves, Crater lake and the points of interest north of Roseburg to Portland.

"Most tourist associations, highway organizations and transportation lines already have new and attractive literature ready for distribution and the communities early in the fall are planning to reap the tourist harvest of the coming year."
