Teammates for 10 Years to Play Here

When the Rubenstein Oregonians meet Southern Oregon Normal's basketball team here Saturday night, Roseburg and Douglas county fans will see not only one of the greatest potential independent quintets, but one of the oddities of the hoop game—two players who have been teammates on championship aggregations for 10 years.

The veteran teammates are Bobby Anet, all-American guard, and Wally Johansen, all-coast guard.

Way back in the season of 1929-30 Johansen and Anet joined the Astoria Y. M. C. A. and were members of the Astoria "Y" team, coached by Dick Strite, present Eugene sports writer. In their initial hoop effort these two lads—along with Bob Bergstrom of Oregon State, Hank Nilson of Oregon and several others—captured the state junior championship.

The next season the "Flying Finns" went to Robert Gray junior high, where they played on championship teams for two seasons before going to Astoria high under "Honest John" Warren. In 1932-33 the Fishermen won the state title, in 1933-34 the district crown, and in 1934-35 the state crown again.

When the guard tandem was ready for college they followed Warren to the University of Oregon, where they won the 1935-36 freshman title. The next year, varsity members in their sophomore season, Oregon tied for the northern division crown; and the Webfoots won the northern division, and last year clinched their three varsity years by winning the division, coast, regional and national collegiate championships.

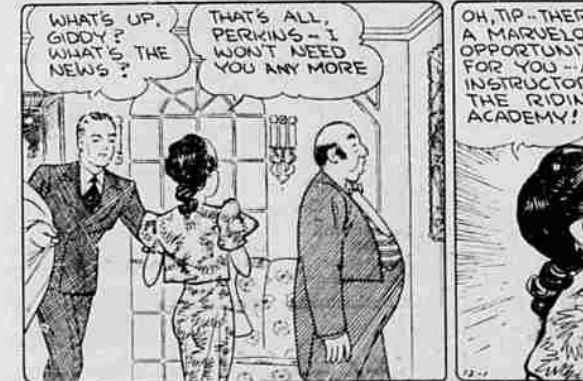
