Turks Accuse Germans of Trying to Stir Up War

ANKARA, Dec. 7.—(AP)—Turkish newspapers today accused Germany of trying to provoke a Turkish-Russian war and said Turkey might demand the recall of German Ambassador Franz von Papen.

The incident arose over circulars bearing the water-mark of the German embassy press service, which reprinted an article from the Moscow newspaper Pravda, communist organ, attacking the Turkish press.

Turkish newspapers declared the Pravda article had been mis-translated. They charged the German embassy with attempting to stir up a bitter debate between the Turkish and soviet press which might have serious consequences. "We realize your intriguing aims but will not fall for your game," the newspaper Aksham declared.

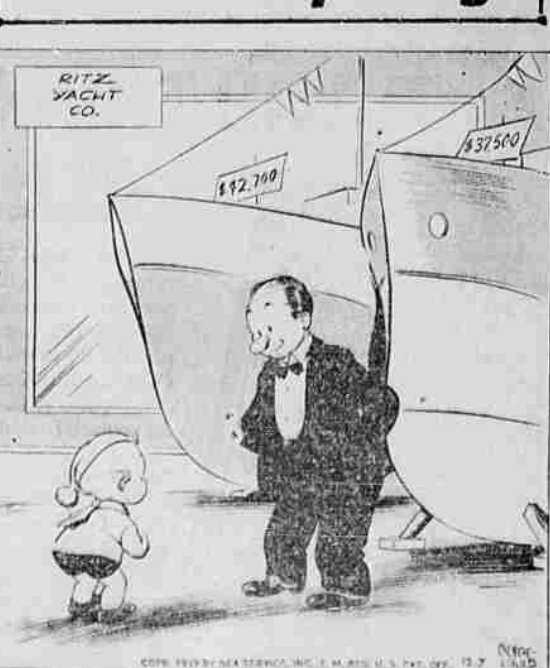

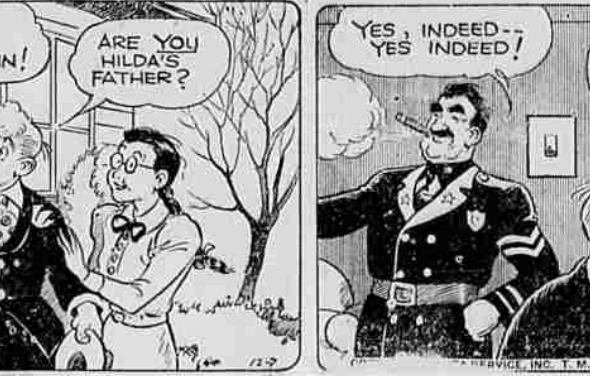
