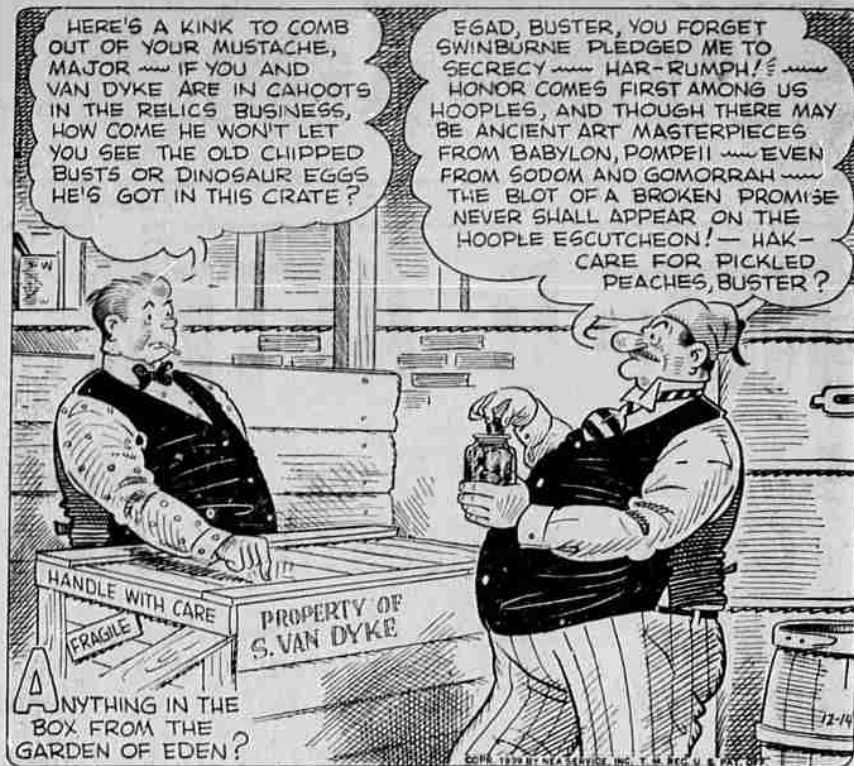

Adequate Pension Program Needed Now, Mott States

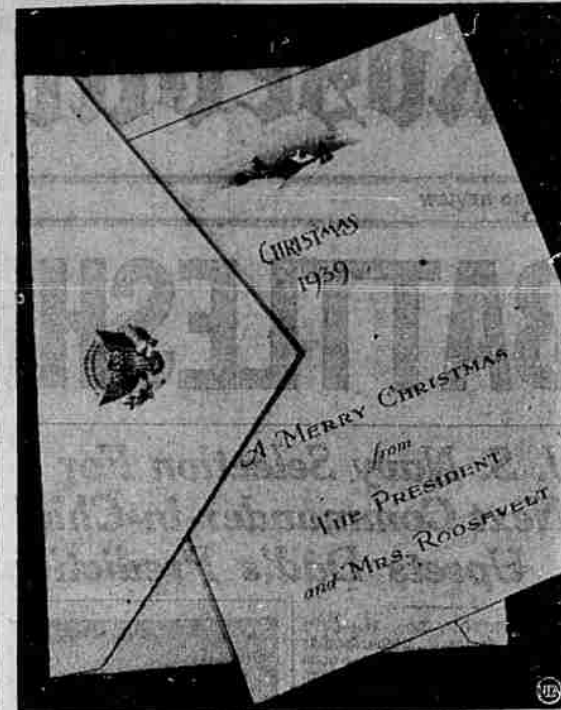
