

Loan Buy Limit In Home Building Set

WASHINGTON, Dec. 20.—(AP)—The federal loan agency, through a new order today, has limited the amount of money that the RFC mortgage company would purchase up to \$2,500 loans made to finance the construction of new homes.

The plan, officials said, was developed in an effort to stimulate the construction of low-cost homes.

Officials said the RFC mortgage company would purchase class 3, title one, loans bearing 4 1/2 per cent interest and a service charge of 1/2 per cent, where the entire proceeds are used to finance new homes, the construction of which is started January 1, 1940.

Officials said the willingness of the RFC mortgage company to purchase these loans undoubtedly would result in private lending
