Brother of Prosecutor Stabs 2 Men in Quarrel

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 22.—(AP)—Layne Everett Pitts, 41, brother of District Attorney Byron Pitts, was arrested today by sheriff's deputies who announced he admitted stabbing a man and his son, the latter so seriously he may die.

Valentine Hoy, Jr., manager of a gravel company, suffered a huge cash in his left side and his left arm was nearly severed, investigators said. His father was cut slightly on the hands.

C. E. Pealer and R. W. Almo, sheriff's deputies, said Layne Pitts declined to draw his pocket knife in self-defense after the Hoy's attacked him with a heavy wooden box and a chair when he called at their office on a business matter.

Pitts, a concrete contractor, said he was seeking a refund for \$125 worth of cement sacks when the argument started.

BERLIN, Dec. 22.—(AP)—Two Germans lost their heads today for high treason, increasing to 41 the number beheaded during the year.

They were Reich Scheer, postal official of Witten, charged with inciting the public against the Nazi government, and Bruno Stanik of Beethle, accused of providing the

Polish intelligence department with secret reports.
