"I cannot say anything until it becomes official," commented the physician, who has cared for the famous children since their birth May 28, 1934.

He declared last Saturday that he had been seeking for two years to be relieved of his duties as one of the three guardians named by the state.

He said he would prefer to be "free to watch their health and personal well-being and not bothered with business arrangements."

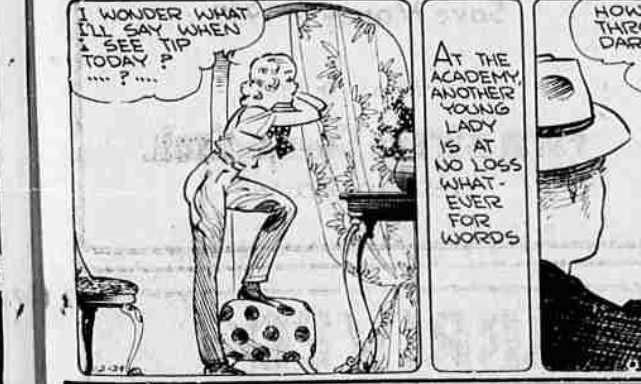
