Income Tax Gain In Oregon Coming

SALEM, Ore., Jan. 2.—(UP)—Oregon will collect approximately \$500,000 more this year on 1939 incomes than it did last year on 1938 earnings, the state tax commission estimates.

The total income tax collection for last year will be about \$4,600,000 and this year's receipts should reach \$5,100,000, the commission believes.

The commission attributes part of the expected gain to the addition of between 4,000 and 5,000 federal employees to the tax list for the first time, and a decided improvement in economic conditions last year over 1938.

The inclusion of the federal workers on the state lists will bring the total number of state income taxpayers to around 94,000 the commission said. This figure does not include corporations, partnerships or other business combinations.

The state income tax is used to offset property taxes and the increase in receipts will be felt on the 1941 property levy providing expenses are kept equal.

Labor Exemption Granted Placer Mining Operators

WASHINGTON, Jan. 2.—(AP)—A seasonal exemption from maximum hours provisions was granted by the wage-hour division today to western gold placer mining operators.

The exemption affects operators in Alaska, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Washington and Wyoming.

They will be permitted to work their employees 12 hours a day or 56 hours a week for not more than 14 work weeks in the aggregate in any calendar year without paying time and one-half for overtime. The exemption, however, does not affect the minimum wage of 30 cents an hour.
