

### Final Results Of Grange-Directed Pest Hunt Given

Final results of the county-wide pest hunt, conducted by Douglas county subordinate granges, under sponsorship of Pomona grange, have been compiled by Fred A. Goff, chairman of the county grange agricultural committee.

The trophies for 1939 was awarded Sunday, Dec. 31. Each of the granges filing a monthly report during the contest will receive a cash prize of \$1.50. The hunt will be continued during 1940.

The results for each participating grange are reported by Mr. Goff as follows:

**Loom Lake:** 3 coyotes, 44 bobcats, 139 weasels, 52 hawks, 3 crows, 6 gophers, 126 diggers, 144 rabbits, 187 moles, 51 blue jays, 49 rattlesnakes, 677 mice; total 1495 pests; 125,175 points.

**South Deer Creek:** 15 coyotes, 20 bobcats, 43 weasels, 199 rats, 21 hawks, 29 crows, 9 gophers, 218 diggers, 334 rabbits, 28 moles, 15 bluejays, 26 rattlesnakes, 611 mice; total 3463 pests, 384,775 points.

**Evergreen:** 4 coyotes, 141 rats, 18 hawks, 18 crows, 1 gopher, 579 diggers, 182 rabbits, 17 moles, 49 bluejays, 236 rattlesnakes, 722 mice; total 2229 pests; 267,075 points.

**Sutherland:** 139 rats, 3 hawks, 1 gopher, 140 diggers, 61 rabbits, 11 moles, 12 bluejays, 54 mice; total 425 pests; 59,500 points.

**Sunnydale:** 21 coyotes, 35 bobcats, 8 weasels, 407 rats, 75 hawks, 50 crows, 203 gophers, 2811 diggers, 168 rabbits, 24 moles, 228 bluejays, 28 rattlesnakes, 1270 mice; total 4359 pests; 621,050 points.

**Glide:** 2 coyotes, 2 bobcats, 1 weasel, 4 rats, 8 hawks, 10 crows, 9 gophers, 203 diggers, 117 rabbits, 22 moles, 20 bluejays, 63 rattlesnakes, 234 mice; total 668 pests; 63,400 points.

**Riversdale:** 3 coyotes, 10 weasels, 422 rats, 62 hawks, 47 crows, 44 gophers, 1283 diggers, 231 rabbits, 24 moles, 35 bluejays, 1 rattlesnake, 522 mice; total 1082 pests; 346,100 points.

**Rescue:** 2 coyotes, 4 weasels, 33 rats, 5 hawks, 35 crows, 78 gophers, 116 diggers, 98 rabbits, 21 moles, 4 bluejays, 196 mice; total 591 pests; 65,450 points.

**KELLOGG:** 17 coyotes, 11 bobcats, 2 weasels, 419 rats, 77 hawks, 26 crows, 199 gophers, 1814 diggers, 235 rabbits, 59 moles, 419 bluejays, 147 rattlesnakes, 567 mice; total pests 4031; 510,075 points.

**Camas Valley:** 5 coyotes, 10 bobcats, 2 weasels, 12 rats, 8 hawks, 12 gophers, 391 diggers, 70 rabbits, 46 moles, 38 bluejays, 10 rattlesnakes, 553 mice; total 1128 pests; 101,150 points.

**Melrose:** 91 rats, 25 hawks, 42 crows, 9 gophers, 353 diggers, 103 rabbits, 10 moles, 8 bluejays, 255 mice; total 896 pests; 94,625 points.

**Smith River:** 12 weasels, 345 rats, 6 hawks, 9 crows, 15 gophers, 593 diggers, 79 rabbits, 200 moles, 33 bluejays, 749 mice; total pests 2414; 257,825 points.

**Fred Weatherly:** 3 coyotes, 1 bobcat, 1 weasel, 42 rats, 9 hawks, 7 crows, 2 gophers, 463 diggers, 21 rabbits, 20 moles, 42 bluejays, 9 rattlesnakes, 388 mice; total pests 1086; 37,300 points.

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### NLRB Upheld In High Court Ruling

WASHINGTON, Jan. 2.—(AP)—The supreme court upheld broad powers claimed by the national labor board today by ruling that a federal court of appeals does not have the right to pass on the board's certification of a CIO union as the exclusive collective bargaining agency for all Pacific coast longshoremen.

This opinion a defeat for the American Federation of Labor, sustained a decision by the United States court of appeals for the District of Columbia that it could not review the board's action in lumping in the voting unit.

The federation had contended the longshoremen of each individual employer should be permitted to determine their collective bargaining representative.

In two other decisions, the court also upheld the contention of the labor relations board that it had the power to direct elections to determine collective bargaining representation without interference by the federal circuit courts.

One of the decisions sustained a board order placing the name of only one labor organization (a CIO affiliate) on a ballot for a run-off election to determine collective bargaining representation.

### Youths Who Beat Oregon Cop Get 10-Year Terms

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 30.—(AP)—Two Tacoma, Wash., youths, Robert Craft, 21, and Glenn Borders, 22, were sentenced to 10 years each in the state penitentiary today on charges of assault and robbery while armed.

They were accused of holding up a suburban bus station manager and a tavern operator.

According to State Trooper Glen MacDonald, Borders slugged him as he was driving the pair to Salem, Ore., following their arrest.

Hocken-smith said Grunden, alias Albert Olson, made no attempt to flee.

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They have been swimming daily since Dec. 16.

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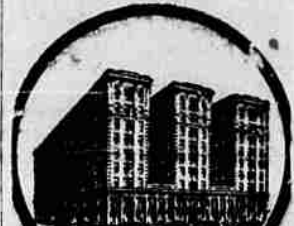
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### December 8 near Jefferson. During the scuffle, the car struck a pole, injuring MacDonald. The trooper held the prisoners despite his injuries.
