Hull Groomed by F. R., Says Wheeler

DENVER, Jan. 9.—(AP)—Senator Burton K. Wheeler (D., Mont.) expressed belief yesterday that President Roosevelt is "grooming" Secretary of State Hull for the democratic nomination for president.

"The talk in Washington is that the president very definitely favors Hull for the presidency and Robert Jackson for vice-president," Wheeler said. Jackson is attorney general designate.

"I don't think if anyone could control the convention definitely," questioned concerning his own role in pre-convention speculation.

The Montana senator was doubtful Mr. Roosevelt could control the 1940 democratic national convention for Hull or any other candidate.

"I have no doubt whatever that he could get a nomination to a third term if he wanted one, but controlling the convention for anyone else would be a different matter," he explained.

"I don't think if anyone could control the convention definitely," questioned concerning his own role in pre-convention speculation.

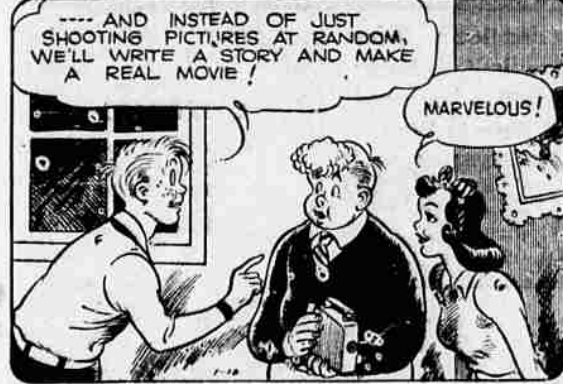
