Funds for Tunnel Allotted U. of O.

EUGENE, Jan. 10.—(AP)—An allotment of federal WPA funds totalling \$87,689 has been made to the University of Oregon to complete the project which will connect all buildings on the campus with a tunnel carrying water, light, telephone and other facilities. It was announced here today by Dr. Donald Erb, university president. Notification of the grant was received in a telegram from Rufus Hoiman, Oregon senator.

The new tunnel, which, like the others will be six feet wide and seven feet high, will connect the new Chapman hall with the library, the education building and music building.

The addition will provide the university grounds with approximately two miles of tunnel, all lighted and adequately heated so that the danger of freezing is removed. The cost of the entire project will be about \$350,000, most of which was provided by the federal government as WPA grants.

Union Head Facing Tax Fraud Charge

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 10.—(AP)—William Bluff, organizer and leader of unions in the film industry, was indicted today by the federal grand jury on charges of income tax fraud.

The government charged that Bluff, head of the powerful AFL conference of studio unions and representative of the International Alliance of Theatrical Stage employees, reported an income of \$5,720 in 1936, whereas his actual income was \$33,773.25.

In 1937, the indictment further charged, his income was actually \$176,416, but Bluff reported an income of only \$7,205, the indictment accused the labor leader of "unlawfully, wilfully, feloniously, knowingly and fraudulently attempting to evade and defeat the

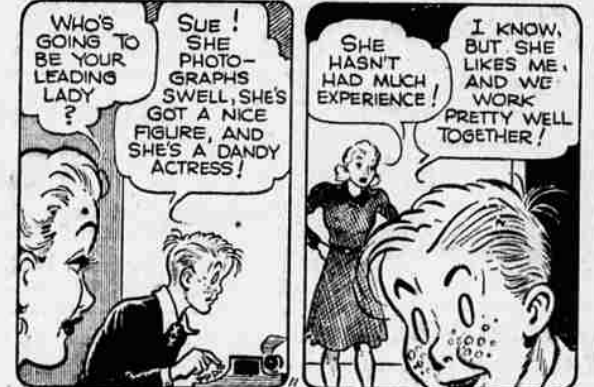
