Dr. Bray is recovering from an attack of influenza.

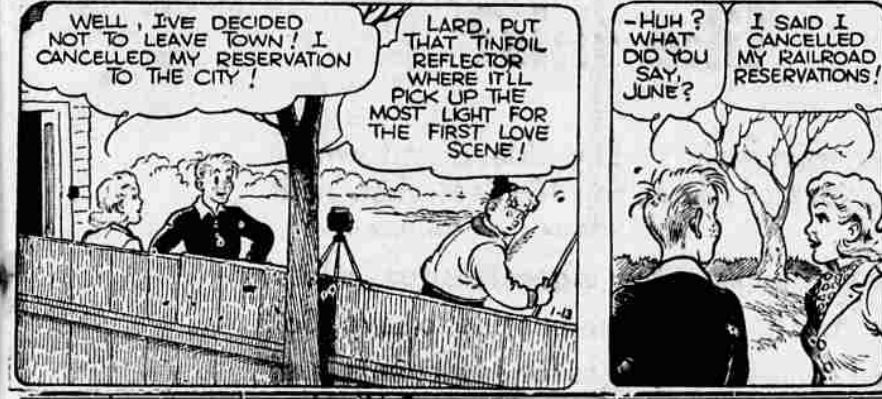

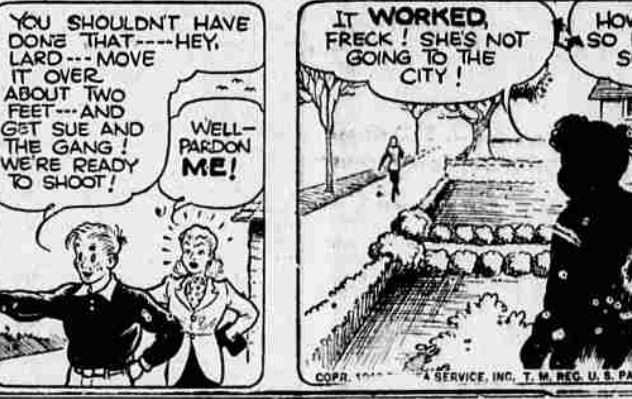
