Murphy, Jackson, Biddle Confirmed

WASHINGTON, Jan. 16.—(AP)—The senate confirmed today the nomination of Attorney General Frank Murphy to be an associate justice of the supreme court.

The action was taken on a voice vote, without audible dissent. The chamber then quickly approved the nominations of Solicitor General Robert H. Jackson to be attorney general and Judge Francis Biddle to be solicitor general.

Murphy, 46 years old, will take his seat on the high court as President Roosevelt's fifth appointment to the nine-member body. A former high commissioner to the Philippines and former governor of Michigan, Murphy will succeed the late Justice Pierce Butler. Jackson, stepping into Murphy's
