

OSC Basketeers Again Lead Race

Cougars Beaten in 2nd Game of Series, 33 to 31, After 5-Point Halftime Margin.

The Oregon State college Beavers are back on top the heap in the northern division. Pacific Coast conference basketball drive as result of their 33-31 victory over the Washington State college Cougars last night. The Cougars Tuesday night won the first game of the series.

Their position is precarious, however. Close behind are the Oregon Webfoots in second place and the Cougars in third.

As the teams head around the first turn in the conference race the Beavers still hold their inside position. They have a two game series tomorrow night and Saturday in Moscow against the Idaho Vandals, who have yet to enjoy the fruits of victory in the league campaign.

A sweep of the Idaho series would make things considerably brighter for the Beavers unless the Webfoots accomplish what the neighbors in Seattle maintain can't be done this week sweep their series from the Huskies. The Huskies are in fourth place.

The Beavers trailed at halftime last night 12-17 but clamped on an airtight defense at the opening of the final half, holding the Cougars scoreless for 15 minutes while they increased their total. By the time the Cougars were able to break through this defense the damage was done.

Hunter, Oregon State guard, led the scoring with nine points. Gentry led the Washington State scorers with eight.

Bank Bandit Shot in San Francisco Battle

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 17.—(AP)—A Nevada cowboy, who attempted to rob a heavily-guarded bank in the heart of San Francisco's financial district precipitated a gun battle on crowded Market street, was believed near death today from bullet wounds.

Also wounded, but not so critically, was Oliver Durr, 54, veteran guard at the bank, Anglo-California, who shot it out with the bandit.

Police Inspector Pat Wafer identified the cowboy as Carl Metzler, 32. He was hit twice in the gun duel before he staggered aboard a street car and fired a shot into his own chest.

Durr suffered wounds in his wrist and back.

The drama started in mid-afternoon when Metzler handed Teller Edward A. Leist a note reading: "Give me all the paper money you have. One mistake and you die."

Leist sounded an alarm. Durr attempted to overpower the gunman and the running gun battle followed.

Interest Rate Boosted on Small State Land Loans

SALEM, Jan. 18.—(AP)—Interest rates on state land board loans of \$1,000 or less were increased yesterday from 5 to 6 per cent. Land Board Clerk Griffith reporting that 11.7 per cent of the board's funds are tied up in loans under \$1,000.
