THE question of whether or not the president will be a candidate for a third term is by long odds the outstanding item of interest in the realm of politics these days.

That paradox may be smoothed out in the following manner: It would be neither good taste nor smart politics for the president to actually seek a third term nomination.

But a number of things point to the very definite possibility that the democratic nominating convention may draft Roosevelt—with or without his actual consent—and nominate him.

A number of states having large electoral votes may put up favorite sons in their nominating elections so as to leave their delegates unpledged to any other major candidate.

The republican party is going to have no lack of candidates. Announced contenders for the nomination include Senators Vandenberg, Bridges, Taft and McNary.

Though Senator McNary's name is included in the above list it is not strictly correct to say that he is seeking the nomination.

Politically, the republicans could do much worse than nominate McNary. He is at least as well known, and as favorably known over the nation as any of the others mentioned.

For more than twenty years he has been a fighter in the senate for legislation for the benefit of farmers. He is not a wealthy man and is allied with no class or group nor is he a part of or even remotely connected with any state or regional political machine.
