The Oregon Motor association said the Columbia gorge is key east of Hildahl Vell and the Wapinitia cutoff is snow-covered.

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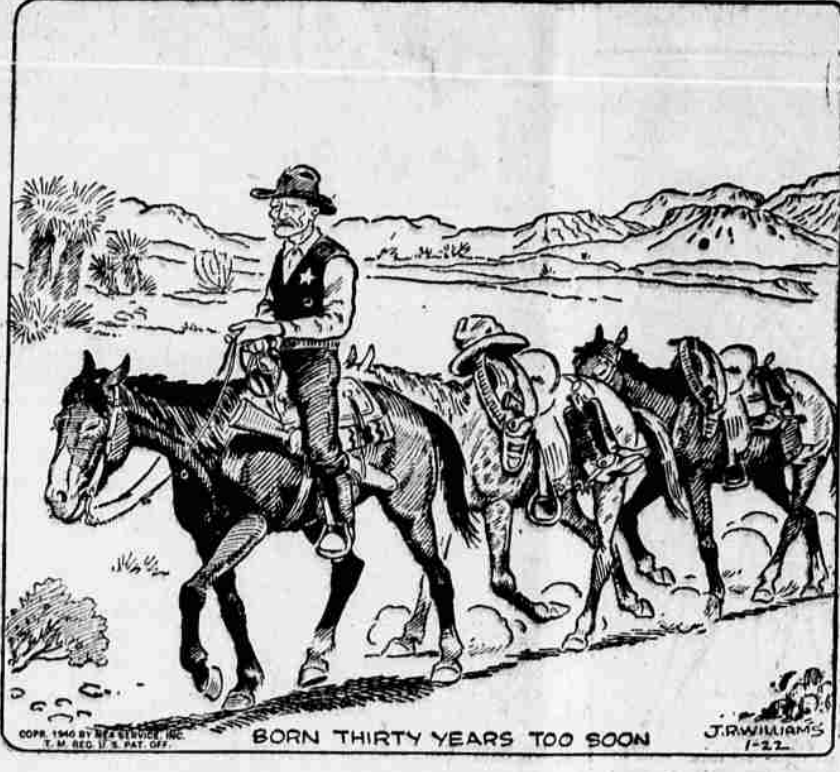

At Seattle, the University of Oregon revamped its lineup Saturday to win the second half of a two-game series, leading Washington all the way and keeping control of the ball through the efforts of two six-foot entries in the lineup.

Washington State needed an overtime period to defeat Montana in a game having no bearing on the conference standings.
