Food "Wireless" To Nazis from U. S. NEW YORK, Jan. 23. —(AP)—A system of "wireless" food to Germany, with headquarters here and branches in 15 other American cities, was reported today by its agents to be doing an annual traffic of about \$1,000,000. The forwarding agency, called the Fortia corporation, was formed by officials detached from the staffs of the Hamburg-American and North German Lloyd lines. It was put into effect after the British, in pursuit of their blockade of the reich, began interrupting the trans-Atlantic movement of mail from the United States. Describing the system, T. E. Kessometer, president of Fortia, remarked: "It's now butter by wireless." There are two standard packages. One contains four pounds of butter, three pounds of Holland cheese, a pound of evaporated milk, a half pound of coffee and a half pound of cocoa. This package costs the sender \$8.50. The other, containing four pounds of butter, two pounds of Holland cheese, and a pound of evaporated milk, costs \$6.70. The American sender simply puts up the money. It is cabled abroad and the actual purchases are made in the Netherlands or some other neutral country near Germany. Packages are made up and sent by ship to Bremen, where they are labeled with the names of prospective recipients and put into the German mails. "The food packages," said Kessometer, "never get into the mails until they are inside Germany. That's why it is so foolproof for Churchill (the British first lord of the admiralty) to interfere with the United States mails." Fortia has branches in Seattle and San Francisco.
