Mine Union Heads Urge Pension Hoist

COLUMBUS, O. Jan. 24.—(AP)—President John L. Lewis and fellow-officers of the United Mine Workers of America today urged that old age pensions under the social security set-up be increased to \$60 a month from the present \$40 maximum, and that the minimum eligibility age be cut to 60 from 65.

Social security taxes on pay-rolls should be abolished in favor of increased levies on higher incomes, said the union leaders, and inheritances and on gifts, said the joint report of Lewis, Vice-President Philip Murray and Secretary-Treasurer Thomas Kennedy to the Golden Jubilee convention of the U. M. W.

Under the present taxation method, the report said, "it is obvious the workers pay the whole tax, for in addition to their direct assessments upon the wage earners, the employees' tax results in higher prices for goods which are paid by wage and salary workers."
