Celebrates 95th Birthday

Mrs. Virginia Applegate, one of Roseburg county's few remaining pioneers, celebrated her 95th birthday Sunday, January 28th, at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Cynthia Germond, on East Douglas street. A family dinner was held at 1:30 o'clock and was later followed by a charming open house affair held between the hours of four and six during which time many old friends and relatives of Mrs. Applegate and her children called to offer congratulations and gifts.

Mrs. Applegate was born Virginia Estes in Polk county, Iowa, January 28, 1845. She came across the plains in 1850 in a wagon train led by her father, Capt. Elijah Estes, containing fifty wagons. They left on the 1st day of May, 1850, and arrived in Oregon the 1st of November, 1850. Mrs. Applegate remembers vividly many of the experiences encountered along the way.

The family first settled in Multnomah county, but soon removed to Umpqua county, where they opened a hotel above Drain, Oregon. She remained here until the time of her marriage in 1860 to Daniel W. Applegate, son of the famed Oregon pioneer, Jesse Applegate. She was the mother of seven children, five of whom are still living. She was left a widow in 1896 and for the past several years has resided at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Cynthia E. Germond, who has one surviving brother, George Estes of Portland, Oregon. She is still very active in reading and sewing.

Feminine Modes Still Dominant

Military Styles Reveal Gain but Not Enough to Dictate Seasonal Fashion Front.

PARIS, Jan. 29. (AP)—A survey of Paris dressmaking trends today showed strictly feminine modes prevailing on all fashion fronts, despite gains made in military styles.

Short, colorful dresses appear in pastel shades and black, edged with gold and silver. Long-skirted evening suits in black wools or blue tulle have fitted or tubed bodices with ruffled necklines, gold mesh pockets or flower-embroidered revers.

Wide-skirted evening dresses are made of chiffons, printed organdies, lace or tulle. Many decollete, modish, often flared, have long, shirred waists or boleros to conceal the thin waists.

Feminine cap notes include spandrels, turbans, flowered toques and paillette caps bristling with tulle or organdie frills.

Important silhouette changes include lowered waistlines, although lower waists are limited in daytime and evening coats. Bloused treatments at the waist are repeated for evening, especially for contrasting bodices.

With few exceptions, the day silhouette is widely flared from the hip down, with waists high; the skirt is natural, or slightly broad; the skirt short. The short skirt came to the middle of the knee; the longest about 15 inches from the ground.

Snuggly-fitted princess coats in silks or wools play up feminine curves. Evening coats are shoulder-length or long straight and loose for summer lines. Suits have tight-fitted jackets, or are in loose box styles, the latter sometimes made reversible when silk lined.
