

# Jobless Pay Law Target of Attacks

## Costs Too Much Money, Chief Plaintiff of Employers; Big Reserve Fund Built Up.

SALEM, Ore., Feb. 21.—(UP)—The unemployment compensation law, one of the more radical social ventures of the past few years, from all indications is due for trouble both in Oregon and in the nation.

Employers are becoming more outspoken in their attacks on it, recommending changes in many instances and in some cases complete abolishment. The chief complaint, stripped of the high sounding phrases, is that it costs them too much money.

Something will have to be done soon with the contribution system because employers' contributions are far exceeding the benefits paid out to unemployed workers. The nation as a whole has a reserve bill up of nearly one and one-half billion dollars and Oregon's reserve is more than \$9,000,000, \$3,000,000 more than the reserve to maintain benefit payments.

One side suggests the maximum and minimum weekly benefits be raised and the number of weeks for which payments are given be also increased. The other wants the excess to be reflected in lower contributions from employers.

### New Plan Not Soothing

The experience rating program, slated to go into effect this year, provides little hope of soothing the employers. The plan provides for payment by the employer on the basis of the amount of benefits paid out to his workers, theoretically making less unemployment by causing the employer to think twice before he lays off his workers.

Opponents do object to that by saying that no employer lays off men unless economic conditions justify it and that forces without the individual plant or unemployment benefit system are too powerful to allow the smooth theoretical operation which proponents of the merit rating system predict.

Another objection is found in the fact that the plan will encourage the employer to restrict his workers to the fewest possible individuals to escape a higher percentage of contributions. The employers do not wish to assume the responsibility for unemployment and few economists will lay the blame at their feet.

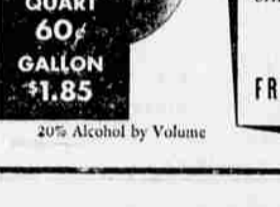
