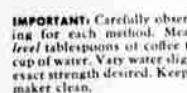

O. S. C. Seeks Title In Tilt With U. O.

"Just one more time," it will be Oregon State college, 1940 northern division basketball champion.

The Beavers entertain their arch-rival, the defending champions from Oregon, at Corvallis tomorrow night in a game which may well decide this year's title.

Oregon State needs but one more game to clinch the crown, and nothing would please the Beavers more than to take that game from Oregon, O. S. C. already holds three victories over Oregon, and tomorrow night's truce will be the final encounter between the pair.

Oregon's only hope is to sweep its remaining games while O. S. C. struggles at least twice in its remaining three contests.

Washington State, which saw its last mathematical chance go through the hoop with Bobby Dier's last-minute foul shot Tuesday night, goes over to Moscow for its final game against the Idaho Vandals. The Cougars had won three.

The season winds up next week with Oregon making the four-game inland empire road jaunt while Oregon State closes at Seattle against the University of Washington.

Only six of the eight teams in the Industrial Bowling league played at the Roseburg Alleys last night, the Standard and Shell Oil teams postponing their meeting until a later date. Montgomery Ward last night took two out of three games from the Douglas Mills, although the latter team had the higher total pins, 2274 to 2221.

Hansen Motors won two out of three from Hotel Valley with totals of 2396 to 2295. Dillard Motors took three straight from Lockwood Motors with total pins of 2533 to 2262.
