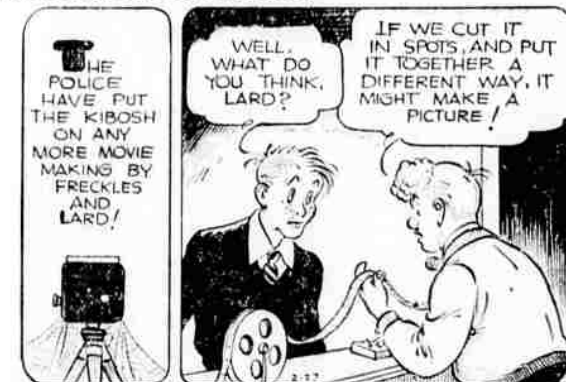

Engine, Caboose Rescue Motorist

TACOMA, Feb. 27.—(AP)—James Kennedy, who had to be rescued with a locomotive and caboose when his automobile plunged 180 feet into a narrow gulch, was still alive today but hospital attendants said his condition is critical.

The 20-year-old youth lost control of his car as it was crossing a bridge last night. The machine crashed through the guardrail. Officer Bob Stittworth said the 180-foot drop "telegraphed the sedan into the size of a coupe."

Because of the gulch's steep sides and the fact it was seven blocks to the nearest road, Milwaukee railroad officials, whose lines run up the ravine, dispatched a special locomotive and caboose to pick up the injured boy.

It took Stittworth half an hour to extricate Kennedy's body from the telescoped car. Ten minutes after he was removed, the machine burst into flames. Kennedy suffered multiple injuries, including a possible fractured skull.

Death Takes Child of Ex-Sutherlin Residents

Word has been received here of the death Friday at Eugene of Ellis E. Stanley, six-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. L. S. Stanley of Oakridge. The child was born in Sutherlin, where Mr. and Mrs. Stanley formerly resided. Surviving are the parents, and two sisters. Funeral services were held in Eugene Monday.

The accident occurred while Hayes and two other youths were siphoning gasoline from a truck at the camp.
