

Roosevelt Loses In Canal Request

Committee Refuses Item For Third Set of Locks; Wake Island Money Also Denied.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 27.—(AP)—The house appropriations committee, whacking away with its economy axe, turned thumbs down today on President Roosevelt's request for immediate appropriation of \$15,000,000 to start a third set of Panama canal locks.

Instead, the committee recommended an \$850,000 fund for preparing plans for the locks, asserting that "in the absence of such plans and specifications the ultimate cost must largely be conjectured."

The committee also followed up the house's recent action in refusing to appropriate \$1,000,000 for a harbor project at Guam in the mid-Pacific by rejecting a \$700,000 request for dredging the channel at Wake island, on the route from Hawaii to Guam.

"It feels constrained," the committee said, to view the proposed Wake harbor improvement as part of a projected seaplane base there, estimates for which have been passed over twice by the house.

Both the Panama canal and Wake island items were part of a \$20,472,567 appropriation bill for the war department's civil functions. The committee reported the measure to the house for action tomorrow.

Axe Bites Deeper. Although the president had requested the estimates for these functions, which include river and harbor work and flood control, to \$20,000,000 from the \$305,125,384 appropriated for the same purpose this year, the committee went still farther.

The \$700,000 budget estimate for flood control, exclusive of the Vicksburg, Mississippi, the Sacramento and San Joaquin rivers, was approved in full, as was a \$30,000,000 item for flood control on the lower Mississippi.

The sum sanctioned by the committee for rivers and harbors, including both improvement and maintenance, was \$66,721,510, representing a cut of \$2,951,510 below the executive request. This cut was made up of the proposed \$700,000 for Wake and \$1,351,510 slashed from maintenance funds.

Wild Bill Boyd Decisions Cooper

SEATTLE, Feb. 28.—(AP)—A slashing rally in the final minutes of the last round gave Wild Bill Boyd, Seattle heavyweight and Jack Dempsey's protégé, a decision over Henry Cooper, New York, in a round main event last night.

Neither fighter had an edge in the colorless bout until the tenth when Boyd drove a stiff right to Cooper's mid-section, doubling on his New York opponent, and followed it with a barrage to the head and body.

Boyd came out of the fight with a big bump under his left eye while a right cross opened up a cut over Cooper's left eye midway in the final round. Boyd weighed 185, Cooper 182.

The six-round special event between Tony Kubik, 152, Wood-Grave, and Ernie Washburn, 152, of Eugene, stole the show. Kubik opened an "iron man's" schedule by winning a well earned decision.

Kubik meets Kid Terry of Eugene in a 10-round bout at Salem tomorrow night.

After a prolonged absence Henry Woods, Yakima, who, reappeared in a Seattle ring to win an unpopular eight-round decision over Johnny Fasano, San Francisco, in the eight round semi-final.

Cleaner body punching gave Woods the verdict. He weighed 141 to Fasano's 139.

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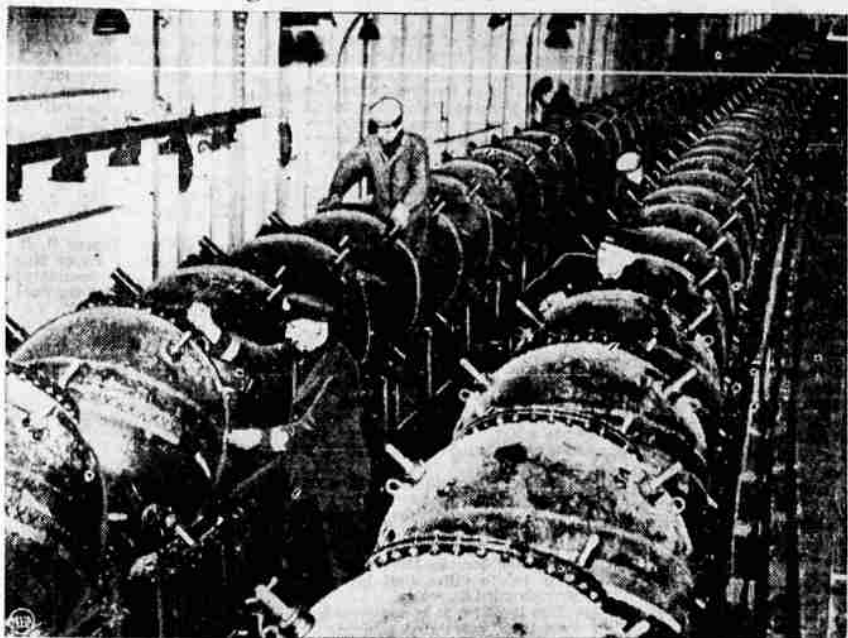

Dies Probe to Hit War Propaganda

WASHINGTON, Feb. 28.—(AP)—Chairman Dies (D-Text), announcing an inquiry into reports of communist and nazism in the motion picture industry, said today that the house committee on un-American activities may investigate foreign propaganda designed to involve the United States in European wars.

Disclosing the results of a two-day private discussion of the future course of public and private hearings, Dies said:

"The committee took under consideration the question of foreign propaganda designed to involve us in the present European war, and it will announce at a later date its decision with respect to the scope of any inquiry along this line."

Dies announced that the committee had voted to:

1. Begin public hearings soon on nazism and communist activities on the west coast, including the motion picture industry.

2. Begin public hearings soon on reports of communist activities in consumer organizations and labor officers of those groups before the committee for questioning.

3. Investigate statements that communist and nazism agents from Mexico are carrying on subversive activities in the United States.

4. Continue its inquiry into the Christian front and Christian militarists.

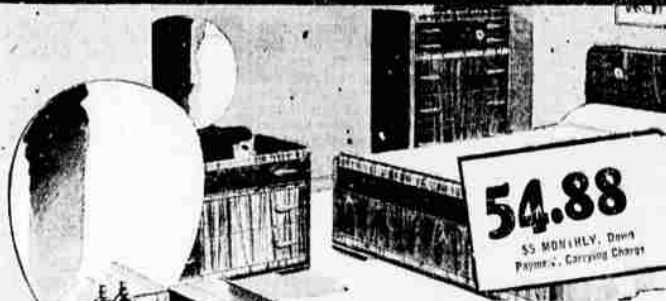

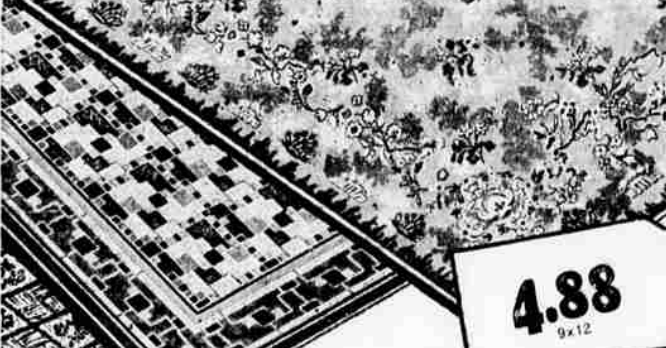

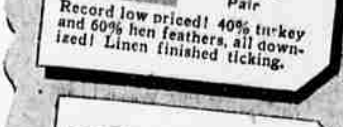
