Firm Forced to Reinstatement 21 Employees, Pay \$50,000

PORTLAND, March 5.—(AP)—Twenty-one Portland employees of Montgomery Ward and company pocketed checks aggregating about \$50,000 and averaging \$2500 yesterday.

They were among 51 employees discharged in 1936, who appealed to the national labor relations board. The board and subsequent court decisions sustained the claims of 21 that they had been dismissed for union activities. They were ordered reinstated with back pay in a final ruling last December by the Chicago federal circuit court of appeals.

The checks were received and distributed by Ben Anderson, attorney for the International Longshoremen's and Warehousemen's local.

Sanipractor Faces 2nd Degree Murder Charge

SEATTLE, March 5.—(AP)—Bertram Hollande, sanipractor physician in whose office the body of Donna Mae Correll, 19, of Nampa, Idaho, was found four days ago, was charged yesterday with second degree murder.

He is accused of causing her death by an illegal operation. Detective Chief Yoris said Hollande confessed Saturday. He remained in the city jail today in lieu of \$10,000 bond. Held without charge is John A. Gray, 24, who said he and Miss Correll were to have been married in a few days.

Shortly after that he died. Less than an hour later, his wife, 85, died too.

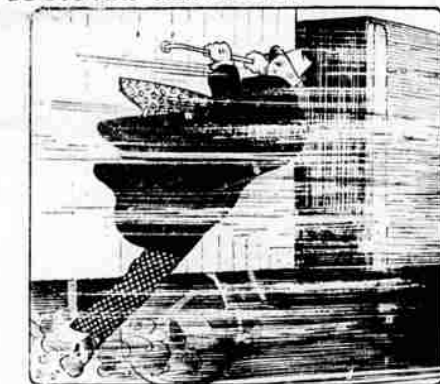
